

July 21, 2024 The Eighth Sunday after Trinity

(Evening Prayer, Book of Common Prayer, 1962)

Dear Friends: In our relationship with God, reading & receiving the Bible, his Word, is crucial - for this is chiefly how we come know who God is, what he has done, and all he has promised to do. Our faith grows in confidence based on his character.

Prayer is likewise vital - for this is how we communicate who we are to this faithful God: all of our hopes, fears, needs and more. We cast our cares on him, because he cares for us (cf. 1 Peter 5:7).

As we pray however, we are reminded that prayer includes more than asking for help, as absolutely right as this is; throughout Scripture we are shown a great wide-range of prayers - including petition and intercession, but also among them: regular repentance, overarching worship, and thanksgiving.

Thankful worship is magnificantly modelled often in the Psalms - "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever." (Psalm 136). We have so much to be thankful for, and this is right (and healthy!) for us to remember, and to bless the Lord for his many undeserved mercies, including our very lives. This summer might we will be helped and our hearts lifted up afresh as we look to the Scriptures (especially the Psalms, and the means of grace the Book of Common Prayer is), for aid in giving us language as we too thank the Lord.
